Small Group Discussion Questions:

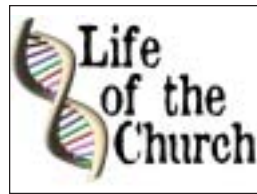
1) What is your attitude towards people who have different beliefs, lifestyles, or values than you do? What is one thing you can do to change that?
